Year 2

Over the last 2 weeks, in Geography, Year 2 have been learning all about the Lake District. We have been looking at the physical and human features of the environment and have been learning new vocabulary such as cliff, valley, lake, mountain, town



and city. The children also spent some time outside using compasses to help them with their directional understanding of North, South, East and West.

Year 4

Year four have spent time exploring the school grounds, they looked for different animals and plants. They then used







this information to creating classification keys, using their working scientifically skills of grouping and classifying.

Year 5

In Year 5, we are studying the coral reefs and the reasons they are endangered. With it being Earth Day this week, we have written some coral reef pledges that detail what we are going to do to make a difference and save the reefs.

Reception

Reception have had a great week learning outdoors and spotting signs of the seasons changing. We've been digging in the mud kitchen area to find minibeasts and some of them have even been adopted and given names!

Year 1

This term in year 1, the focus has been on Shakespeare and the children have





been looking at the play A Midsummer's Nights Dream. We have had a go at re-enacting the play where each child had a character and their job was to represent their actions and the characters feelings through acting.

Year 3

This week year 3 have been learning about the importance of water for plants. In Science, we placed some white flowers in water and blue food dye and observed the flowers turn blue. This was to demonstrate how water travels from the roots up the stem and to every part of the plant.



<u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 created their own shadow puppets as part of our 'Light' unit in Science this week. Next week, we will test them and observe how



shadows are created and how the distance from the light source affects the shadow.
